Based on twelve years of research, including personal letters and diaries, extensive searches of official records and numerous interviews, this book brings to life a previously little-known aspect of the conflict. It is the story of a select group of soldiers, both regular and conscript, serving their country against all odds. The 53- tonne Centurion tanks were not only involved in intense fighting in conjunction with infantry to capture enemy defences and defeat attacks, but also fought their own battles against enemy mines, ambushes, and an unforgiving terrain and climate.

This book takes the reader inside the tanks to share the experiences of their crews in action in the jungle. We see the gunner, trying to survive the heat inside the turret, while identifying designated targets; the operator trying to maintain communications, while keeping the guns loaded; the driver, trying to see his way forward, while keeping his head down; and the commander, trying to locate enemy positions, while directing his driver and giving fire orders to his gunner.

The account also reveals how the mechanics beat overwhelming challenges to maintain the twenty-year-old tanks, while the field engineers risked their lives protecting them against mines.




The events of World War 2 proved beyond any doubt that the strategic bombing campaign greatly contributed to the Allies' ultimate victory over Nazi Germany. British night bombing raids and daylight carpet bombing missions flown by the USAAF crews rained destruction on German cities killing thousands of civilians in the process. Amidst this massive loss of civilian life the destruction of German industrial targets seemed almost like a side note. The arms race that kicked off even before the war began produced military aircraft capable of reaching ever higher operational ceilings.

At first thin air at high altitudes was the domain of reconnaissance machines, but before long fighter and bomber aircraft began to venture there as well. In those early days high-altitude flight was a challenging business: it required the use of pressurized cockpits and boosted powerplants capable of delivering adequate power at altitude.



The Lavi fighter program, the largest weapons-development effort ever undertaken by the State of Israel, envisioned a new generation of high-performance aircraft. In a controversial strategy, Israel Aircraft Industries intended to develop and manufacture the fighters in Israel with American financial support. The sophisticated planes, developed in the mid-1980s, were unique in design and intended to make up the majority of the Israeli air force. Though considerable prestige and money were at stake, developmental costs increased and doubts arose as to whether the Lavi could indeed be the warplane it was meant to be. Eventually the program became a microcosm for the ambitions, fears, and internal divisions that shaped both the U.S.-Israeli relationship and Israeli society itself. But the fighter never made it to operational service, and until now, the full breadth and significance of the Lavi story have never been examined and presented.

Lavi: The United States, Israel, and a Controversial Fighter Jet traces the evolution of the Lavi fighter from its genesis in the 1970s to its scrapping in August 1987. John W. Golan examines the roles of Israeli military icons and political leaders such as Ezer Weizman, Ariel Sharon, Menachem Begin, and Yitzhak Rabin in the program and in relation to their counterparts in the United States. On the American side, Golan traces the evolution of government policy toward the program, detailing the complex picture of the U.S. foreign policy apparatus and of U.S.-Israeli relations in general — from President Reagan's public endorsement of the program on the White House lawn to Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger's unremitting attempts to cancel it in succeeding years.

A fascinating read, Lavi includes multiple books in one, discussing the tactical reasons leading to the development of the Lavi; examining the evolving political and budget intrigue leading to its cancellation; and offering a detailed technical analysis of the Lavi versus its alternatives. The vehicle that was to become the Type 82 Kübelwagen had its roots in the development of the Volkswagen "People's Car." With war clouds gathering over Europe, the efforts of the Volkswagen facility were turned to the production of military vehicles. In January 1938 work began in earnest on the vehicle that would come to be popularly known as the Kübelwagen. The term Kübelwagen means "bucket car" and was actually applied to a variety of vehicles from a number of makers, but has come to be synonymous with the Volkswagen Type 82.

Even under the skilled tutelage of Dr. Ferdinand Porsche, two years of work and testing were required before the Kübelwagen took its classic form. It was soon to become as ubiquitous as the U.S. Army's Jeep and was also designed a produced as an amphibious car known as the Schwimmwagen.


As always, this Visual History title mixes rare and interesting archival imagery with photos of restored vehicles. Produced with the full and complete cooperation of the Kübel Korps, one of the world's largest Kübelwagen-Schwimmwagen restoration groups, this title presents only the very finest restored examples. Early examples of the Kübelwagen are featured, as is a very rare 1945 model. No detail is left unrevealed, with interiors, multiple engine views and undercarriages. 

For many, the quintessential image of World War II in the Pacific is represented by images of amphibious tractors, or Amtracs, churning toward volcanic islands. These tractors were the result of the genius and perseverance of Donald Roebling. Roebling was descended from a family of engineers and bridge-builders. His great-grandfather, John Roebling connected Manhattan and Brooklyn, which was completed by Donald's grandfather, Washington Roebling. Donald's creation however would span thousands of miles in the Pacific.

With a great spirit of patriotism, Roebling granted a royalty-free license to his patents to the government, who contracted with FMC (Food Machinery Corporation) to build improved vehicles known as the LVT-2. This series of amphibious tracked vehicles (Amtracs) were developed from the original tracked amphibious vehicles built by Donald Roebling, known as the LVT-1 or Alligator. Several documents from the earliest days of the LVT-4 project referred to the vehicle as a "Modified LVT-2 with Stern Ramp", before the official designation of Landing Vehicle Tracked Model 4 was assigned. Ultimately, companies such as FMC, Borg-Warner, Graham-Paige and St. Louis Car Company would produce thousands of these Roebling-designed Alligators in a variety of styles. Descendants of these vehicles continue to see service today around the world.




Description:

The M7 Priest family of vehicles was designed to provide armored units with highly mobile organic artillery support. Mechanically, the initial vehicles were based on M3 medium tank components, while later production used M4 Sherman components. The name was derived from the pulpit-like appearance of the anti-aircraft machine gun ring and mount. Between April 1942 and August 1943, American Locomotive Company built 2814 of these self-propelled guns. Joining them in 1944, American Locomotive (ALCO) built a further 500 vehicles, and Federal Machine and Welder Company built 176. Simultaneously, Pressed Steel Car Company was building 826 M7B1 self-propelled guns. The M7B1 was very similar to the late M7s, but were based on M4A3 components.

The M7 Priest comes to life in a very big way in this expanded format Visual History title. At 168 pages, this enlarged title features over 190 wartime photos of the famous self-propelled gun, all of them full or half page in size. Covered are all the sub variants of the M7, as well as the differences between each of the manufacturers. A great level of detail is shown in these photos. Details such as the power plants, interior stowage and gun laying equipment are illustrated.

Culled from newly sourced private and governmental archives, many of these images are seen here for the very first time. A superb reference for the Italeri or Dragon scale model kits.

Royal Prussian Jagdgeschwader Nr III was the third of Germany's vaunted fighter wings to be formed during World War 1. The mission of the organisation was to export resistance, subversion and sabotage to occupied Europe and beyond, disrupting the German war effort and building a Secret Army which could one day help Europe throw off the Nazi yoke.

Potential agents were put through intensive paramilitary and parachute training and taught how to live clandestinely behind enemy lines, to operate radios and write in secret codes. They lived in constant fear of arrest, and of treachery and betrayal by collaborators.

This fully illustrated book looks at the men and women who made up the SOE, the rigorous training to which they were subjected, and their lives during and after the war.







There were 19 squadrons during the summer of 1940; it was only later the numbers swelled. At times the combat initiative was lost to Bf 109s and Fw 190s, but with better training and increased performance Spitfire clawed its way back. By 1944 it was employed as fighterbomber in various theatres of war; many pilots thought strapping bombs below this aircraft verged on insult but with aerial targets in short supply this as the most effective way of reaching the enemy. Spitfire saw action up to 1948 and there are still around 50 airworthy today.
